CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

This chapter presents about background of the study, identification of the problem, delimitation of the problem, formulation of the problem, objective of the study, significance of the study, and operational definition.

A. Background of the Study

Humans are social creatures that cannot be separated from social interaction between one another which then results in communication. One of the tools used to communicate is language. Language as a communication tool has a purpose so that we can convey something and can be understood by others. This article reports on the use

of comic-books in reading instruction and literacy development. Despite being viewed as childish or valueless, these popular books can be used to increase interest in reading in adolescents.

The purpose of this study was to use comics to improve students' vocabulary acquisition through reading comprehension. Researchers focused on using Snow White comics to improve students' vocabulary acquisition. Data was collected through testing. The test was divided into a pretest and a posttest to determine the students' vocabulary acquisition skills before and after treatment. A questionnaire was also used to examine students' reactions to this approach. The sample was 63 students from grade 6.

The reason researcher chose this title because, nowadays the children do not read a comics. They like to watch movie or playing games. So researcher want to tell that when children read comics it is very helpful in learning to read, besides that children can also get new vocabulary that they have never known. Interest in reading for today's children has begun to decline, while reading activities are very helpful in improving students' speaking and written skills.

B. Identification of the Problem

use English comics books for students grade 6th SD Muhammadiyah Bausasran as a learning medium to increase reading skills and add new vocabulary that would be obtained.
