The implementation of the No Smoking Area Regulation (KTR) No. 64/2015 in school settings began in 2015. Elementary Schools, Junior High Schools, Senior High Schools, and Vocational High Schools, both public and private, are all covered by the regulation. The purpose of KTR is to create a safe, healthy and friendly school environment as soon as possible. KTR is also an effective way to protect the community (school community) from tobacco houses, but the regulation has not been fully implemented by schools in Yogyakarta. The purpose of this study was to determine the implementation of KTR in the school environment in Yogyakarta City and identify the problems faced in implementing the regulation.

Methods. This study used a quantitative approach with a combination of observational and crosssectional survey research. The population in this study included all schools in Yogyakarta City which amounted to 298 schools, both elementary, junior high, and high school / vocational school. The number was 162 schools. The sampling technique used the "Proportional Stratified Rondom Sampling" method. Data were collected by a single survey and then analyzed descriptively using a computer system.

Results: The following are indicators of successful implementation of KTR: Input indicators: 89.5% of schools in Yogyakarta have a written report on Smokefree Areas (KTR); approximately

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
